

ECO Presbyterians: Covenanting with God, Together

This is the first of four articles that will cover what "ECO Presbyterian" stands for. One of the distinctives of the Christian faith is: God covenanting with people. God isn't angry at us; God isn't distant or unconcerned with us. Instead, God covenants with us. This covenanting is for our benefit as well as for His purposes.

Jesus tells his disciples at the Last Supper that there is a New Covenant with God that comes through faith in Jesus. The bread (his body broken) and the cup of wine (his blood poured out) are the tangible symbols of this covenant. In some ways, it's not that the covenant is 100% new, but instead that Jesus changes how our side of the covenant (established in the Old Testament) with God is fulfilled: through Jesus. Our trust in him makes his covenant-fulfilling work on our behalf effective in our lives.

This covenant fulfilled gives us forgiveness and righteousness from God (and not us!) and brings us into relationship with God our Creator and Heavenly Father – in this world, and in the next. Jesus' resurrection gives us the hope of eternity spent with him and our Heavenly Father. As such, the Christian faith emphasizes – with good reason – faith in Jesus, and having a relationship with him.

But our covenant is also with each other, because God's covenant is not just with us individually. His covenant is with a people group. It was Israel in the Old Testament, and it's those who trust Jesus since then.

Therefore, being a Jesus follower means being a part of his people: The Church. We are sent, together, by Jesus to live on mission for him. He's fulfilled our side of the covenant, and our response of faith is to live as he invites and sends us to do. We see this throughout his ministry and the rest of the New Testament.

Being a part of a local church – such as Rose Hill – means being on mission with those people. We are bound together by our common faith in Jesus, in a covenant relationship with him, and therefore also with each other. In ECO Presbyterian churches like ours, we take this covenanting seriously. It's what the "C" in ECO stands for: A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians. I would like to invite you to take this covenant seriously as well (You probably already do). But I would invite you to consider taking it more seriously.

First, if you've never become a Covenant Partner ("member" but in ECO we use this other term) here at Rose Hill Church, I hope you'll consider doing that. I will be leading a class **the first couple Sundays in February** that will be all about our church, our denomination, and what it means to be a Covenant Partner here. If you're not sure about that step, that's fine; use this class to find out more about Rose Hill and make sure God is calling you to worship, serve, and grow in faith here with us.

SESSION

The Session of Rose Hill Church met on January 9th at 7pm for their stated meeting to discern God's will for His church at Rose Hill.

The Session reviewed the projected 2023 year-end financial status of the church and approved the budget for 2024. As shown in the table below, the tithes and offerings received during December resulted in the church ending the year with a projected surplus of \$3622.82. The final 2023 financial statements and the 2024 budget will be included in the Annual Report, which will be released prior to the Annual Congregational Meeting on January 28th.

Pastor Brian presented a draft proposal for a three-month sabbatical during the summer of 2024. His terms of call with Rose Hill Church allow him to take a sabbatical every six years. Since he has been with us for over ten years, this is somewhat overdue and the elders were very encouraging and supportive of Brian's proposal. Many of the details remain to be worked out, and you will hear more about that during the coming months.

The Session was encouraged to hear of some increase in enrollment at the Rose Hill Christian Preschool, though enrollment remains below the level needed to cover all operational costs. This situation was anticipated when the elders decided to reopen the preschool. They committed at that time to subsidize preschool operational costs during the first year while enrollment was building up. Our Preschool Director, Jennifer Fenn, is hopeful of a few additional students in the next few months. And the next few months are also the prime time of year when Jennifer will be promoting the preschool to the public and beginning to enroll students for the 2024-25 preschool year.

The Session also heard from Dan Wolfe that the renovation of the west restrooms near the Fellowship Hall is planned to begin at the Church Workday on January 13th. Work should be well underway by the time you receive this newsletter article.

Here is a projected year-end summary of church operating finances for 2023. As of this writing the church books have not been closed for the year and some adjustments may still be made. The final financial reports will be available in the church Annual Report.


