

ECO Presbyterians: Order

This is the second of four articles that will cover what "ECO Presbyterian" stands for. The full name of our denomination is "A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians." So, ECO isn't an acronym, but it's our shorthand denominational name. In February's article, we looked at "Covenant" – God covenants with us, and we covenant with each other. In this month's article, I want to look at "Order," the second word in the full name of our denomination.

"Order" has a couple of potential meanings. First, is that we like to do things "decently and in order" as Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 14:40, about worship. But there's also a sense of this word "order" that has a broader use in our faith. We define "Order" like this within ECO: "To commit to a shared way of life as we unite around a shared theological core." It's more like when the word is used in regards to monastic "orders," where these people are committed to a shared way of life together.

The theological core around which we are ordered is perhaps best (both concisely and completely) expressed in the Apostles' Creed: "I believe in God the Father Almighty, and in Jesus Christ his only Son...." In other words, we are united around the Triune God who has come to us in Jesus, who lived, died, and rose from the dead so that we might be washed clean of our sins, and be in relationship with God here/now, and for eternity. God has made this possible by his grace because of his deep love for humanity – including each of us here at Rose Hill. The Resurrection of Jesus, that we celebrate at Easter at the end of this month, is the starting point for proof of what God has done and is doing through Jesus.

So, love for God and one another, because of God's love for us, is what binds us together as we live together in this "ordered" way: encouraging, loving, correcting, forgiving, confessing, serving, etc. We do all this for one another, and those around us that God puts in our path, so we might lead people toward Jesus and into a deeper walk with him.

One of the ways we live an ordered life together is in worship. (We discussed this at our recent Session meeting, and you can read more about that a bit later in this Messenger.) Each Sunday – except on occasions when musical worship leadership vacancies make this untenable – there

are both traditional and modern elements of worship: Organ, choir, bell choir, traditional hymns, prelude/postlude, and the worship band. The sermon, scripture reading, the prayers, greeting one another, and the offering haven't really changed from either service – they were pretty much in common when we had two services.

The Session of Rose Hill Church met on February 20th at 7pm for their stated meeting to discern God's will for His church at Rose Hill.

The Session welcomed elders Bud VanDerAa and Linda Muilenburg to their new terms of service to Rose Hill Church, and expressed its sincere thanks and praise for the work of elder Bob Harshbarger as his term is ending. A significant portion of the meeting was devoted to the annual refresher course on the duties of an elder and on how the Session at Rose Hill Church operates. Some of those duties are particular assignments given to elders for the current year, and those assignments were volunteered for and approved. Later in the meeting, elder Linda Holbrook (who attended via Zoom) presented her resignation to the Session for health reasons and all the Session members offered prayers of thanks and for God's blessing for her just before she left the meeting.

During the past 7 months of worshipping in a single blended service on Sundays, some church leaders have received comments from congregants concerning the mix of music and worship style in our services. Many are encouraging and appreciate both the variety and having us all together on Sundays. There were also some comments that expressed the desire for more traditional music in the mix, while others desire a more contemporary style for the entire service. In the discussion that followed all of the elders recognized the divergence of these views, and that all of us are making certain concessions on our worship preferences; but they confirmed their conviction that combining the services was the right thing to do for the unity and fellowship of the congregation. The pastor and elders will be praying and asking God's guidance while they consider our worship together and seek His will for it. They also request that all congregants do the same.

The following items received a brief review during the meeting:

- Pastor Brian asked the elders to consider the future potential uses of the Mission House. He will send some ideas that he has to them and will ask for their ideas and feedback.
- Pastor Brian provided an update on his planning for a sabbatical during the summer months.
 The elders encouraged him not to be too frugal when considering courses or activities that
 would help him to grow, but rather to make his sabbatical the best it could be both for him and
 the church.
- The newly appointed elders on the Nominating Committee will need to re-engage the committee in the spring to fill two vacancies one elder to replace Linda Holbrook and one deacon to fill the open position.
- Bud and Dan reported on background work that continues concerning trees on the church property that need to be taken down to avoid hazards to the church and neighboring properties.
