




The Lord's Prayer

Carole Lynn Smith passed away peacefully at her home in Kirkland, Washington at the age of 87. Carole was born in Yakima, Washington on February 9, 1934 to Norman and Mary Sorensen, and had two younger sisters, Sheila (Doug) Sinning and Linda (Peter) Byeman.

Carole met Michael (Mike) Smith at Yakima High School and the two were married on February 27, 1955 at Fort Benning, Georgia after Mike was drafted into the army. They went on to have six children: Sheree (Steve) Andrews, Greg Smith, Jeff Smith, Becky (Lowry) Snow, Sandy (Richard) Price and Brian (Joan) Smith, nine grandchildren: Leon Smith, Gabriella and Jazlyn Andrews, Brandon and Derek Snow, Nicole and Jordan Price, and Zachary and Connor Smith, and three great-grandchildren (with a fourth expected in October).

Carole is survived by her sisters, all her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, and by her beloved cousin Joan Anderson. She was preceded in death by her parents and by her husband Mike, to whom she was married for 55 years until his death in 2010.

Carole attended Washington State College (now WSU) and completed her college education at the University of Washington, earning a degree in education. While raising her children she worked as a substitute school-teacher at various school districts. After her children were grown, Carole worked for many years at Check Ride Driver Training Services, a business founded by her husband and her son Jeff.

In retirement, Carole loved to travel with family and friends, visiting many locations all over the world. She was a decades-long, active member of the Rose Hill Presbyterian Church where she served as a deacon and where she developed many strong, lifelong friendships. She was also a longtime member and supporter of the Seattle Children's Hospital Guild Association.

As a very social person, Carole was always up for activity and fun, whether it be her hiking (later walking) group, attending the Village Theater with friends, or attending her grandchildren's sporting and school events. She really loved to chat, and she loved cats!

Above all, Carole treasured the time she spent with her family, either in person or from afar. Family events, talking with and corresponding with her children, grandchildren, and other family members was very important to her.
